Course Description	Sometime around the publication of Garcia Marquez's classic novel One Hundred Years of Solitude, a scene of extreme violence that, like the banana worker massacre in Garcia Marquez, seemed to define modern literature that was inspired by Garcia Marquez's example and the literature that led up to the atomic bomb, with the Japanese invasion of China in the 1930s, and with the Allied bombing of Hiroshima, the perspective of literature as a whole, by inspecting earlier examples of atrocities committed in the lives of the inhabitants of the Caucasus.
