### Dear A&S Faculty and Staff colleagues,

All of us, as citizens and as part of the Columbia community, have been processing the dismaying rise of anti-Asian violence since the emergence of COVID. In these last two weeks, this work has become particularly acute, since the murders of Soon Chung Park, Hyun Jung Grant, Suncha Kim, Yong Ae Yue, Delaina Ashley Yaun, Xiaojie Tan and Daoyou Feng in Georgia, persons of Asian descent living at the intersection of multiple forms of social inequality, gender discrimination, and racially delineated victimization.

This past week a member of the A&S faculty community was targeted on the street, and, indeed, this is not the only such incident to be suffered by one of our own. Faculty of color actively and publicly working towards an inclusive society have been singled out in particular. We cannot fulfill the mission of the university without standing together against all forms of racism and discrimination.

With the leadership of the Committee on Equity and Diversity, particularly Prof. Ellie Hisama, there will be a panel discussion on anti-Asian racism and violence on Wednesday, April 21<sup>st</sup> at 2pm; please save the date and see below for advance information on the event and registration.
