

Pre-Requisites

This is just a reminder about the rules regarding pre-requisites for economics courses. Below I have listed the pre-requisites for all of the undergraduate courses. Hence the list below tells you what you can expect your students to already know. Please note that if a student asks you to take your course without having completed the mandated prerequisites then that approval does not guarantee that the student will receive credit for the course from the department. The **only** way for the student to get a waiver for a prerequisite is to speak to his or her advisor in the department. If the advisor approves that waiver will be placed on file in the department so that when the student goes to graduate we will have all of the necessary paperwork. So when a student asks to take your course without the prerequisite send that student to see his or her advisor - do **not** grant them permission to take the course yourself.
