Please submit a short abstract (400 words) and a one page CV to **historyacrosstheisciplines@gmail.com** no later than January 25th, 2018. Papers competing for the John Flint Prize should be a maximum of twenty pages in length, while the committee recommends that presentation papers be between eight and ten pages in length, or suited to a 20-minute presentation. The John Flint Prize, (\$250 honorarium), will be awarded to the paper that best demonstrates scholarly excellence.
