Big Hole is one of the battles that occurred between the Nez Perce and the U.S. Army during the summer of 1877. The park is recruiting for one Historical Interpretation Intern through the Student Conservation Association to share events that led up to the Nez Perce flight, the details of this battle, and the story of the Nez Perce once the conflict drew to a close.

Duties include staffing the visitor center and making bookstore sales. The intern will also present talks, guided walks, and demonstrations. The anticipated dates of employment are May 7, 2018 – February 10, 2019.

Location: The Big Hole Valley in southwestern Montana is home to large working ranches. It is surrounded by the Beaverhead National Forest, which offers many outdoor recreation opportunities.

The nearest village providing basic amenities is Wisdom, MT, which is located 10 miles east of the park with a population of 98 people. Several towns with full services are located within 65 – 85 miles of the battlefield.

Benefits include a food stipend, a travel stipend to reach the park, and free housing on site consisting of a private bedroom in a shared house, free Wi-Fi, and access to gym equipment. The intern must provide his/her own transportation to the park. A personal vehicle is required in order to access recreational and shopping opportunities.
