Applicants must be in their second or third year in Columbia College or General Studies at Columbia University. Students majoring in American Studies are especially encouraged to apply.

How to Apply

The application consists of a proposal and a letter of support. The proposal must include: (1) a description of the research project noting how the applicant will make use of relevant resources at the Jay Heritage Center (750-800 words); (2) a resume; (3) a short bio paragraph (50-100 words); (4) a current academic transcript. Applicants should also contact a potential Columbia faculty advisor to request a brief letter of support for the project, to be sent by email to mg3898@columbia.edu.
